Greetings from Rev. Joe

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The seasons of the year bring varied experiences to each of us. We hope for joy and renewal. We often find these. We also sometimes encounter setbacks and loss. Many of you have stayed in touch with me this summer. Each of us in our own way has encountered the things life has brought us. I have been keeping all of you in my prayers: prayers of thanksgiving for blessings received, and prayers for courage and strength to face the problems that reflect the truth that we are not able to control our lives as we might like. The more powerful truth is, though, that no matter what happens, God stands with us through it all. In prayer and meditation we can

begin to feel God's love in our times of joy and sorrow, knowing that in the end God makes all things new, and heals all troubles. It's hard to wait because we can't know when that will happen. In the words of the psalm we often find ourselves saying, "How long, O Lord?" But in the resurrection of Jesus we can be confident that the promise is real. And our confidence grows as we share our experiences of life and our experiences of God when we gather in community. I am so looking forward to worshipping with you and serving God with you when we gather again on our Welcome Back Sunday, September 16th. My prayer for us is that, in gathering to share another liturgical year in praise and worship of God we will be able to deepen our faith and be sustained in our current lives by God's saving promise.

We will have a busy and fulfilling year. I call your attention to the many activities described in this issue of The Grapevine. I would like to emphasize a couple in which we at St. Andrew's will be deepening our service to our broader Church. On October 20th from 8 AM to noon we will be hosting the Merrimack Valley Deanery in its annual workshops on evangelism, mission, worship and congregational development. Please plan to join your sister and brother Episcopalians that day to share the learning in these workshops, and/or to host by being here to help with coffee and light breakfast, and to help our visitors find their way around our building. On June 8th, 2008, we will be hosting the deanery Confirmation. Our diocese has given us a wonderful gift by asking us to host this major event at which five of our teens will be confirmed along with many others from across the Merrimack Valley. We'll have more information about this as the year goes on, but please make a note to mark your 2008 calendars when you get them.

In the meantime, our many lay ministries have been going strong, and will gather strength in the fall. I ask your prayers for them, and for all of us that we might have a year that builds on the joyful hope and anticipation of great things to come that we have found together.

Welcome Back Sunday

Welcome Back Sunday is scheduled for September 16th. Sunday school registrations will be held beginning at 9am at which time children and parents will have an opportunity to meet the teachers and learn about this year's program. Immediately following, there will be a special group-wide activity for the children. As is our custom at St. Andrew's, children will join the already in-progress worship service at about 10am. Regular Sunday school classes will begin at 9am on September 23rd. One noteworthy change will be made in this year's First Communion program. Instead of a year long program, children interested in First Communion will be integrated into a regular age-appropriate Sunday school class. In the months leading up to First Communion Sunday (the date is still to be determined but it will be in late Spring 2008), there will be a handful of special sessions on Communion specific topics for the children (and sometimes their parents) with Val and Rev. Joe. First Communion Sunday itself, an experience traditionally enjoyed by our entire church family, will proceed as it always has. We hope this new format will make better use of our teaching resources, as well as insure that, for the most part, our children are with their respective peer groups during their Sunday school experience. Generally, First Communion is for children in 2nd grade and above, but please speak with Val, Rev. Joe or myself if you have any questions.
